2014 Legislative Session Wrap-up

The 2014 legislative session was one of the more traumatic ones in recent years as the legislature grappled with reduced revenues resulting from lower crude oil production. PCE was fully funded for the next fiscal year. Following are the energy-related appropriations in the capital budget that have yet to see the impact of the governor's veto pen:

- \$232 million for the new power and heating plant at UAF, consisting of \$24.5 million in general funds, a \$50 million reappropriation from AIDEA's SETS loan program
- \$87.5 million in bond proceeds from the Alaska Municipal Bond Bank Authority
- \$70 million in revenue bonds to be issued by the University
- \$29 million for AHFC's weatherization program
- \$22,843,900 for the 26 projects recommended under Round VII of AEA's renewable energy fund
- \$20 million for continued Susitna-Watana Hydroelectric Project studies
- \$15 million for AHFC's home energy rebate program
- \$7.3 million for AEA's bulk fuel upgrades program
- \$5,341,396 reappropriation, of the remainder of a \$10 million grant for the Chikuminuk Hydroelectric Project, to Nuvista Light and Power Cooperative for a regional energy plan, wind project and intertie
- \$3,750,000 for a new tank farm in Kipnuk
- \$3,560,000 for a new diesel powerhouse in Kake for Inside Passage Electric Cooperative
- \$3,550,000 for a new tank farm in Kake
- \$3,320,000 to SEAPA to increase the dam height at the Swan Lake Hydroelectric Project in Ketchikan
- \$2,025,000 to the Department of Commerce, Community

and Economic Development to develop a rural energy infrastructure plan for areas without direct access to the proposed gas line from the North Slope

- \$1,560,000 for a power system upgrade in Nunam Iqua
- \$1 million for purchase and installation of a generator in Unalaska
- \$940,000 to AVEC for upgrades to the Bethel system
- \$750,000 to AHFC for energy-efficiency monitoring research
- \$750,000 for a distribution project in Tuntutuliak
- \$700,000 for a distribution project in Kwigillingok
- \$500,000 to AEA for implementation of an energy plan
- \$330,000 to AEA for its electrical emergencies program
- \$250,000 to RCA to study the feasibility of an independent system operator or similar structure for transmission facilities in the Railbelt
- \$250,000 for powerhouse and distribution improvements in Koyukuk
- \$200,000 for solar roof panels at the community building in Kake
- \$200,000 for a boroughwide LED lighting project in the Northwest Arctic Borough
- \$175,000 to Nushagak Cooperative for a substation in Dillingham
- \$99,953 for a distribution system upgrade in Port Heiden
